Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical, Laudato Si', is subtitled "on care for our common home" and is a commentary on consumerism, irresponsible development, environmental degradation, and global warming. In the encyclical, Francis challenges us to take "swift and unified global action" on these issues. Despite there being an apparent corporatized push for hi-tech "green initiatives," there is a wealth of wisdom to be found in the natural systems and can serve as a guide for the spiritual life. This session will explore the spirituality of Laudato Si' and how it connects to the principles of permaculture, which uses the principles of regenerative agriculture, rewilding, and community resilience in congruence with indigenous and traditional knowledge.

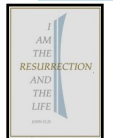
