March 17 - March 19 - Cost - We offer a sliding scale with a suggested fee of \$325 per person.

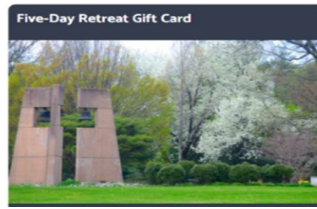
An experiential dive into the wisdom traditions of East and West. We will utilize the Yoga Sutras of Patanjali and Richard Rohr's Immortal Diamond.

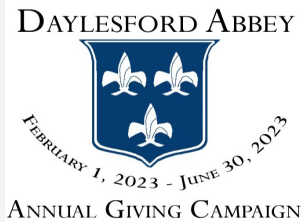
Retreat Gift Cards Now Available

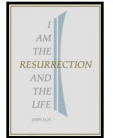
